Trial and Case Highlights

- Successfully persuaded the Johnson County Superior Court to grant summary judgment in favor of a used motorcycle dealer based on the Indiana Products Liability Act's ten-year statute of repose.
- Obtained judgment in favor of the defendant in a small claims case concerning where the plaintiff alleged that the defendant gas station sold her the wrong type of fuel, which resulted in damage to her vehicle.
- Successfully persuaded the Hamilton County Superior Court to deny partial summary judgment to the plaintiff as to the issue of negligence per se, on the grounds that the statutes plaintiff relied upon did not provide a basis for negligence per se under Indiana law.
