# **Trial and Case Highlights**

- Drafted a winning brief in Wisconsin Supreme Court case clarifying the 3-step process in coverage analysis of commercial general liability policies, overturning precedent of Wis. Pharmacal Co., LLC v. Neb. Cultures of Cal., Inc.
- Awarded a summary judgment in favor of a homeowner's association where the former owner sued the association, claiming she still retained the memberships.
- Defeated a motion to enforce arbitration agreement, despite longstanding rule strongly in favor of enforcing such agreements.
- Drafted winning brief in Illinois appellate case. Plaintiff, a purchaser of units in a Chicago condominium, appealed grants of summary judgment and dismissals of various counts relating to defendants, condominium association and realtors, alleged representations and promises relating to the sale of subject units.
